An Appeal from Father Penna

My Dearest Family,

"What God has joined together, let no one separate." (Mk. 10:10)

Over four hundred times I have turned from a couple who have just pronounced their wedding vows to repeat these Gospel words of the Saviour in the hearing of all gathered. It is a warning and a plea: a warning to those present not to be stumbling blocks – *scandals* – for this couple's journey of becoming a family and a plea to God to be the source of their "joining". By far, this warning and plea has been attended to – sadly, separation and division has sometimes ensued. Marriage and family life are not easy. It requires constant resistance to the 'text messages' sent by the Divider – messages that call for anger, judgment, and resentment and cause people to 'separate'.

Today, I repeat these words, "What God has joined together, let no one separate", to all of us: God's family at St. Paul's Co-Cathedral. My father-heart is breaking. I see families divided within themselves, from other families, and within this parish family. We are all exhausted by this COVID crisis. With tiredness comes irritability, with sadness comes anger, and with fear comes resentment. I understand how natural are the first two, but I am concerned about the source of "fear". We are being sifted in a new way. People fear this virus. People fear the vaccine. People fear for their futures. People fear for the future of our society and world.

Do we allow our fear to shape our way of seeing other people? Do we allow our fear to crowd out our inner peace and prayerfulness? Do we allow our fear to make us less compassionate and more self-righteous? Do we allow our fear to make us less loving?

Forty-four times in the New Testament we are told "Do not be afraid!"

"Do not fear, only believe" (Mk. 5:36) Jesus commands in the face of sickness and death.

"Take heart, it is I; Do not be afraid" (Mk. 6:50) Jesus assures those terrified by storms.

I believe with all my heart that Jesus is saying this to us today. I beg you – my precious family – to hear His voice. While the Divider tell us to be afraid so that he might have power over us, Jesus tells us to surrender to His Love that we might not fear and be free.

"There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear" (1 Jn 4:18) Jesus loves us perfectly. When we know His perfect utter love for us fear is cast out. Cast out also is separation.

Our Heavenly Patron, St. Paul, knew well what a divided community looks like – and proclaimed how the Love of Christ becomes flesh and heals. It is a proclamation that most couples choose for their weddings. I know one married couple who have this proclamation on a painting and who stand before it whenever they are arguing. I ask you. I beg you. Read this every day. Read it over and over every day.

Ten times every day read it. Hear Jesus' voice, "**Do not be afraid, little flock**" (Lk 12:32) How I love you.
