'Thanks': The Story of a Word

I have been re-reading Margaret Visser's *The Gift of Thanks.* 500 pages on the practice of saying "thank you" in history and around the world. How much is packed into that little word that we were taught by our parents: "Now Stephen, say 'thank you".

Our word – "Thank you" – comes from the German roots of English: 'Danken'.

That word is close to another German word: "Denken" which means "to think".

Of course, that is why "thank" and "think" are so close. What does that mean?

Thankfulness is not just a feeling, it is first of all an awareness.

Thankfulness It comes from realizing what has been done for us by others

and from appreciating such good fortune and kindness.

A "thankful" person "thinks" differently about everything. Like Ste. Thérèse of Lisieux a thankful person sees that,

"Enfin, tout est grâce"- "In the end, everything is grace".

She said that while dying of tuberculosis.

'Grace'.

There is the other word for thanks I was taught by my parents: the Italian word "grazie".

Here comes the pasta! "grazie!" we say to the one who hands it on. That is what we all do at every meal, do we not?

We start out by "saying Grace" ... "Bless us, O Lord" ...

Grace comes from a Latin word: gratia.

Romans saw that the glue that held society together was giving and receiving

- and that word - gratia - was used for what was given and what was received.

"Grace" was the gift and "grace" was returned by receiving. Giving and receiving.

All is grace indeed.

A "grace" way of thinking also lies buried in the story of this word.

The Roman word 'gratia' came from the Greek word, 'charis'

which in turn means "something which delights".

There it is – the deep deep root of "thanks".

When someone gives us something we say:

"How delightful!", "Beautifully done!"

Thankful thinking sees beauty and says "beauty"

Let us see beauty – then – my dear family.

I see beauty when I see you – indeed, I do.

You delight me! How delightful you are!

Beautifully done Lord God! You have done beautifully in making my family.

"euCHARISt" - Lord God, you give me such a beautiful gift!

"eu**CHARIS**t" – Lord God, you make into such beautiful gifts.
