3rd Sunday of Easter May 1, 2022

Christ is Risen, Alleluia!

Trampling Down death by death and to those who were in the grave He has brought life!



So many folks are caught in the wounds of their past – and the older we are the more the wounds. The scourge of the pandemic has been that all the old wounds from relationships – especially in our families – have been deepened. We worried about the physical *co-morbidities* that often resulted if the sick dying with COVID, what is the death-toll of families as a result of relational *co-morbidities*?

‘Christ is Risen, Alleluia!’ the Holy Church sings in this great Week of Weeks. “He is Risen indeed, Alleluia!” is the Holy Response that echoes even in the empty wounds of our relationships. Did we not meet Jesus last Sunday invite us with Thomas to “put your finger in my side... in my pierced wounds”? Jesus is wounded in our wounds and He is rushing towards us with victorious love

in the wounds that divide us.

This beautiful image is by the Italian Duccio who worked in Siena in the first decade of the 1300's. There are several representations of the Resurrection stories but this one remarkable for the way in which it echoes the traditional iconography of Eastern Christianity which turns to the mystery of the **Descent into Hell** (which we profess in the Apostles Creed) in portraying Easter. We see Christ clothed in gold paint – the Eastern colour of divinity – breaking down the doors of Hell. Satan lies defeated under His feet as in his left-hand Christ carries His Cross which has now become a victorious battle flag fluttering in the wind. Christ is taking the hand of His ancestors – our ancestors – Adam and Eve. Behind him are figures of the holy ones of the Old Covenant who have been waiting for Christ to set them free. Can you identify them? I can see David and Solomon and Isaiah and Elijah ... and John the Baptist. Heaven can only be theirs – can only be ours – because of Jesus Christ!

The Cave of Hades or Hell is a gaping wound on the hill and it contains the members of Jesus' family – the Family of the Father – who are divided and waiting for healing. So too Jesus is knocking down the doors which are the scabs of our wounded families. Satan thought to trap us in the division that is his weapon – but the victorious banner over us is the Cross.

Let us be the hand of Jesus to reach out to grasp the hands of those who are divided from us with fresh pandemic hurts and old dead relationships to which we have resigned ourselves. That is the gift the Holy Spirit blowing the banner in the victory march as the gates of hell break before us.

When our Diocesan Priests retire from parish life, they receive both Old Age pension as well as Canada Pension, but these are reduced based on the fact that they earn far less per year than most lay persons.

When they retire, an amount of \$1350/month comes to our Diocesan priests from the PPRF through the investment of contributions and donations through the St. Joseph Mutual Aid Society.

Currently there are 15 retired priests in our diocese who rely on the PPRF for their basic needs.
