5th Sunday Lent Passiontide Begins April 3, 2022

"Upon Him was the punishment that made us whole, and by His bruises we are healed." (ls. 53:5)

Every time that I see the red hands marking our entrance I get angry-sad. When can we get those removed?

One of our young parishioners challenged the Mayor at our encounter to support us when they come off. Will they re-appear? Will this vandalism continue?

Is this now business as usual?

The Pope is meeting with delegations from First Nations in a profound step of Reconciliation – and the media spins this into the division and anger of politics and power.

### "He was crucified, suffered, and died"

Romans were masters of politics. When they could not coerce local leaders into becoming clients their military might was brutal. The public spectacle of crucifixion was an effect way of cowing conquered people into submission. There wasn't any particular cruelty for the soldier executioners – this was business as usual. As usual, people died in this particular business.



So too in war – its business usually looks like children being held by mothers as they flee ... unless they are old enough to be given guns to hold while killing or being killed.

So too in conquest – its business looks like stealing children away from families and their traditions. Colonialization by "industrial schools" or "gender theorists" always targets the children.

But on the Cross that day near Jerusalem – business wasn't quite usual. The One crucified was the Lord God through whom all things were made. His bruises were not usual – for God the Son bore every bruise of every war and conquest. This Innocent Child bore all punishments earned and unearned of every child that ever was. My punishment. Your punishment.



Today, His Church enters **Passiontide** in solidarity with Jesus Christ, the Crucified God, repenting the marks that He has had to bear for us. In sorrow, we cover our statues and our hearts – for we have vandalized those holy images of God around us, marking people with our crimes. We do not turn away because through a Love that is only possible for God we see God wearing the bruises we give and we receive. And healing us.

Healing everyone.

May the red hands bruising our Co-Cathedral entrance symbolize this punishment that makes us whole. May Easter wash away our angry-sad making sins so that we can be about the new business of healing.
