Catholic Education Week

Before coming to St. Paul's, my academic and priestly ministry was focused on teaching, particularly the teaching and formation of Catholic School teachers, administrators, and trustees. You might say that Catholic Education has been my vocation as a priest. I continue to serve in this area as the Bishop's Delegate to the GSCS as well as being the national chaplain of the Canadian Catholic School Trustees Association.

The faith in God that saves me was given by parents who themselves were very devoted to Catholic Education. Did you know that my Dad was the first boy to be registered in a Catholic High School in Saskatoon? Dad gave 33 years of his life to teaching at St. Thomas More College. How wonderful it was to see Catholic Education extending from Kindergarten to College. I think that at a certain point we began to take for granted Catholic Education in Saskatchewan. Our schools were born in strife – the violent opposition of the Ku-Klux-Klan (spurred on by ministers calling for "one school system") saw crucifixes torn out of schools and Religious Sisters attacked. Yet, it was the leadership of parents committed to **the fundamental right of parents to educate their children** that saw Catholic Schools flourish through the service of women religious and clergy. As the number of clergy and Sisters diminished, Catholic Education became the work of the Lay Faithful as our Catholic Schools carved out a vital place in the life of Saskatchewan for the formation of generations of citizens.

Of course, the citizenship to which Catholics are born through Baptism is a Heavenly One. That is the vision that anchors Catholic Education: that Jesus Christ is the only "gate" to Truth and Life. In Christ is found the gift of the Church through whom the Holy Spirit brings forth excellence and happiness in life. In a materialistic world where education can so quickly be seen as a means of credentialing individuals to be better consumers and producers to keep the engines of society running, Catholic Education lifts the minds of children to understand their incredible dignity of having a place in the great plan of God's Reign. In a time when the bigots of the KKK have been replaced by the smug warriors of secularism and relativism, Catholic Schools stand as the only remaining spaces in the public sphere where God can by name be worshipped and loved. Where children and families and not worldly ideas about children are promoted and served, "Not as the world gives." Sadly, I sometimes wonder if our schools which flourished in adversity have lost their keen sense of passion for the faith in worldly success.

Will Catholic Schools continue to be able to resist the pressure of intolerant progressivism? Will parents be able to direct the formation of their children or will schools become government laboratories where elites experi-

ment on children as they struggle to impose their "ideas"? The answer, of course, is **'YES'**. Why? Jesus Himself tells us today: He does not "give as the world gives" as He asks, "the Father, and he will give you **another Advocate** to be with you forever".

Yes, the "Spirit of Truth" has been the Spirit of Christ's Church, a Spirit who generation after generation "will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have said to you." The gates of ignorance and hell have always fallen before the Holy Spirit who has established the schools and universities that have transformed the world.

Pray for the success of our School Foundation campaign to support the provision of all-day Kindergarten in our Community Schools so that these children may have a good foundation for their education. Let us pray also that Catholic Education may be protected by being founded in holy teachers who love the Church and listen to the Lord who says, If you love me, you will keep my commandments
