**13th Sunday
Ordinary Time
June 26, 2022**



June this year ends with the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. June is the month of the Sacred Heart. How wide the welcome in the Heart of our God the Son! You and I have our home in this Heart. The beat of our own hearts is always filled by the Holy Spirit singing the holy rhythm “*Abba, Father*” (Gal 4:6). Yes, in the Heart of Jesus each of our hearts is caught in the very Love that is the Holy Trinity. June is the month of that Sacred Heart Love.

Our world dances frantically to the angry challenge of each person insisting on their own song of love, dividing into ever smaller tribes of dancers attuned not to God but to the flesh-thinking that makes love a weapon.

Yet we surrender to the rhythm of the one Love – Father, Son, and Spirit – that fulfils the law’s longing: “*You shall love your neighbour as yourself*”.

This sets us free – truly free – freedom that does not treat the world, other people, our bodies, or our God as objects to be used for pleasure. We hear St. Paul today:

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery... do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become enslaved to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, “You shall love your neighbor as yourself.”

If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another.

Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. (Gal 5:1, 13b-16)”

How my spiritual-father heart sang together with parents, families, and parishioners to witness the First Communion of our children. The Spirit-transformed Bread that is the very Flesh of God the Son came into the bodies of our children, how full of joy we are to witness. There will be many noisy gongs sounding in their lives, singing flesh-songs that want to enslave them to “*sexual immorality, impurity, debauchery, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these.*” (Gal 5:19-21).”

But nourished by the Flesh of the God the Son they will know the power to sing the song of freedom in the face of slavery. Filled with the sound of the beating Sacred Heart of Jesus they will know joy that comes with inheriting the kingdom of God.
