4th Sunday of Easter April 30, 2023 World Day of Prayer for Vocations

“I am the gate for the sheep” (Jn. 10:7).

Whenever Jesus says, “I AM” He is claiming the name of the God of Israel.

“I AM the Good Shepherd” captures our minds.

Yet He also says that as God He is “the Gate for the Sheep”

St. John uses the Greek word that simply means “the Door.”

Elsewhere, St. John tells us what this door opens: Heaven. (Rev. 4:1)

In Latin, the word for “door” is ostium and because it sounds like “Host”,

St. Thomas is able to make a connection in the beautiful hymn we sing most days at the start of Adoration:

O Salutaris **Hostia**,
Quae coeli pandis **ostium**;
Bella premunt **hostilia**,
Da robur, fer auxilium.

O Saving **Host** (Victim)
Who widens the **door** of Heaven,
Warlike **Armies** press (us)
Give (us) strength, Bring (us) help.

Who we see when we kneel before the Host in Adoration is the Door of Heaven.

The pastures opened by the Sheep Door and through which the Good Shepherd leads us

Is the Eucharistic Lord – offered to us not only for Adoration but in Communion.

The Good Shepherd who is also the Gate for the Sheep is not a mere image: He is Eucharist.

What a conspiracy of love: the Eucharistic Lord is our Everywhere: Heaven’s Door, the Way to Heaven, the Shepherd leading us to Heaven, Heaven as Food, Heaven itself.

Foes (hostiles) press on from every side But the Lord of Hosts (armies of Heaven) welcomes us as the Host (Lord) through the Door (ostium) from which pour Heaven’s strength and help which pours on us everywhere in Jesus – The Shepherd, The Sheep-Door, Heaven.

Michael's Musical Musings

“I am the Good Shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me.” So begins the Gospel Acclamation for this Sunday, continuing the words of Jesus even after the reading of the Gospel. Christ is the New David, the true shepherd of His flock. The sheep knew David’s voice; all we, like sheep, know Christ’s voice.

Jesus, like all pious Jews in His time, reflects often on the Psalms of David. But David was not merely a shepherd, he was also a musician. In fact, the two professions are intimately connected. Often tending to his flock for days on end, David would sing to them and himself. When he would call his sheep he sang, for the voice carries much further that way. And as he sang, he composed psalms (“ - מִזְמוֹר *mizmor*” which is derived from the verb meaning “to pluck” as in plucking an instrument). I have to think Psalm 23 (“The Lord is my shepherd...”) was one of his favorites out in the fields.

His voice calmed and comforted his sheep. They knew him by his song. The New David, Jesus Christ our Lord, sings to us now. In fact, the whole of creation is but a beautiful love song that began with the love of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. I pray that we attend to that heavenly music and lift up our hearts and voices in to join in praise of Him who shepherds us.


