"Just show up and things will happen" - St. Mother Teresa of Kolkata

The Son of today's parable who said "Yes, sir,' but did not go." (Mt. 21:29) should listen to Mother Teresa. Easy to say, "Yes" but to **do** "YES"? That is the particular grace marking a mature Christian. It is a grace because it comes to those who live the Mystery of Jesus Christ who is the Word speaking Love become Flesh doing Love.

Not a God who speaks Creation, makes policies and rules for the Creation, and then leaves Creation alone to stumble along – but the True God who "shows up" in the Flesh in the midst of Creation.

Today we hear St. Paul quoting an ancient (one of the most ancient?) songs of Christians that celebrates that God really and fully "showed up" in Jesus of Nazareth – the Messiah.

though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness.

And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross. (Phil. 2:6-8)

There is a Greek word for what this ancient song celebrates: **KENOSIS**.

Kenosis means "self-emptying"

God becomes a human person (KENOSIS) so that the human person can become divine (THEOSIS).

The priest at Mass makes this hymn a prayer at Mass when he mixes wine and water and says, "Through the mystery of this wine and water may we come to share in the Divinity of Christ who humbled himself in our humanity"






