



"And immediately the man's ears were opened his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly" (Mk. 7:35)

Recently, I came across the observation of a psychologist that higher education had moved from cultivating in students a passion for *discovery* to reinforcing *defensiveness*. It is understandable that students who in their vulnerable years as they establish their sense of themselves would find unsettling the ever-shifting sands of popular opinion which is pumped constantly into their lives on the phones that have been basically implanted in their bodies. It does not help that the artificial world that these phones bring with them lead them terrified that they might be mocked and bullied at a moment's notice. Everything seems to place them on their back heals in a defensive position.

And it is not just young people ... all of us live is such an unforgiving and judgmental world.

It is too easy to try and keep one eye "on the room" to see how what we say is received or, worse, rejected. This is the death of *plain speaking*.

Of course, one should never be deliberately rude or judgmental – but it is an essential part of hum an dignity that – seeking to love others more than to be loved by others – we speak truth lest we consent to lies by keeping silence.

"Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense.

He will come and save you." (Is. 35:4)

The reason why we lie-by-keeping-silent is that our old adversary whispers to us telling us that this is the easy way. He is the father of lies of course. Short term, lying might seem easy, but long term it brings chaos because Truth will always "come with vengeance, with terrible recompense." (Is. 35:4)

Truth has come! Jesus Christ is Truth! You and I, have been baptized in the Truth. We have had our ears touched by Jesus through the minister of Baptism. Jesus commanded our ears 'Be Open' and our tongues "Be Released". We do not live in the world as those always looking over our shoulders to see what others think lest they not like us, rather, we look ahead to the One who leads us with clear truth knowing that He is utterly in love with us.

People at our work, in our families, in our schools, live so often in a desert, deserted by truth. In this desert the life-giving waters of love are replaced by the sands of manipulation and fear-filled defensiveness.

No defensiveness for us. "Praise the Lord O my soul!" $_{(Ps.\ 146)}$ Boldness is ours!

For not only have we been baptized, our ears have been opened by the Holy Word of God! Our tongues have received the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of Christ Jesus!

So, let us not be afraid to "sing for joy" the Good News of Jesus, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak." (Mk. 7:37)



And our songs, our missionary witness to others shall be as "waters breaking forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert." (IS. 35:6)
