Is not this just for Lent? Why look to the Cross now?


"Ogni casetta ha una crucietta."

The strange thing – almost unbearable – is that while our lives are forever changed by a gaping wound never to be healed in this world, this world continues on it way. Yes, there are moments of real sympathy, there are immensely kind offers of support, but... people are busy with their own things and their own pain. People might say, "I know what you are going through" ... but they do not. They cannot. The wound is particular. The pain – like all pain – cannot be felt by anyone else.

And the busses keep running and the stores stay open and ... it all feels wrong.



Save us O Holy Cross!

It was like this for Mary, her family and the friends of Jesus. It was like this for Jesus. His brutal death was for the world around just another insignificant moment of Roman brutality in a brutal indifferent world. Their lives were altered forever. But here is the not-secret-anymore truth – the world was altered forever.

No longer are there gaping wounds with which we are left indifferently alone. Jesus knows that aloneness and abandonment. He accepted this all so that there can be another who feels our pain, there is another who knows even more than we what we are going through ... there in the wound is God.

And so, we are Saved by the Holy Cross and the Loving Lord who surrendered to it ... so that He can triumph through our crosses.
