# Dedication of the Lateran Basilica November 9, 2025

#### St. John Lateran & St. Paul "Kusch"



John Lateran is the Cathedral of the Pope. Built by Constantine on the palace of the Laterani about 311 A.D. it has survived in the shape of its foundation, though being renovated many times, especially during the Holy Year of 1650.

St. Paul's in the first Cathedral of Saskatoon. Built on the land of the Kusch family, it was completed in 1911 – 1600 years after John Lateran the "Mother and Head of all the churches." This Holy Year we begin – after much delay – the renovations of the "Mother church" of Saskatoon.

Starting with the Oblates, the Kusch family and through "Generations of Faith" the resources of Catholic pioneers have raised a temple for those who live in Saskatoon. For 115 years have grown, "All kinds of trees for food… the water for them flows from the sanctuary. Their fruit will be for food and their leaves for healing" (EX 47:12).

The water of Baptism, the Blood of the Eucharist, the Sacraments have flowed from the sanctuary. Families, parishes, a hospital, schools, social services, missions, have all been the trees bearing fresh fruit watered from this particular temple on the banks of the Saskatchewan.

Now, having received approval from the Bishop for most of our plans, we begin to recraft the Beauty in which our Saviour Christ Jesus will meet our offspring and those brought by hope to our city and ask,

"Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person. For God's temple is holy, and you are that temple." (I Cor 3:16)
