Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

I intervened at the end of a round-table discussion of the Federal Government's Bill C-9 that saw 45 ministers – mostly Evangelical, Pentecostal, and Non-Denominational – meet with MP's fighting this bill that will essentially give the Government authority over the Word of God. I pointed out that implying that society should evaluate Scripture as "Hate Speech" is breathtaking in its arrogance. It is also a clarion call to Christians – sadly divided by how to employ the Holy Scripture – to be united in one voice reminding the Government of the first line of the Charter of Rights and Freedoms:

"Whereas Canada is founded upon principles that recognize the supremacy of God and the rule of Law."

A united voice of Christians serves the whole of Canadian society – including those whose "religion" is of a faith or of no faith – by advocating for a rule that is rooted in Christian culture: "2. Everyone has the following fundamental freedoms: (a) freedom of conscience and religion" (Charter). For those who believe Jesus Christ is the Good News, St. Paul's cry, "woe to me if I do not proclaim the gospel!" (1 Cor. 9:16) impels us to defend the freedom to proclaim Jesus as the Gospel. St. Paul's exhortation is directed to each of us, let our prayerful action for Christian Unity by lobbying our Catholic brother, PM Mark Carney to defend the Charter (mark.carney@parl.gc.ca).



I have been blessed this year to have followed the daily reflections of Oswald Chambers (a Scottish Baptist Evangelist who died in 1917) in the collection *My Utmost for His Highest*. This book is extremely popular among Evangelicals and Baptists and quite outside of my normal reading interest. Of course, as a Catholic theologian I note some fundamental theological limitations ... but the depth of the spiritual love with Jesus in Chambers words brought me to the heart of Christian Unity: Union with the Heart of Christ. Here is a passage engaging this Sunday's Gospel of John the Baptist giving us the heart of our mission as baptized disciples in Christ's Holy Church :

"The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" ... The missionary's message is the limitless importance of Jesus Christ as the propitiation for our sins, and a missionary is someone who is immersed in the truth of that revelation.... The missionary's message is not nationalistic, favouring nations or individuals; it is "for the whole world." (Lk. 24:47) When the Holy Spirit comes into me, He does not consider my partialities or preferences; He simply brings me into oneness with the Lord Jesus.

A missionary is someone who is bound by marriage to the stated mission and purpose of his Lord and Master. He is not to proclaim his own point of view, but is only to proclaim "the Lamb of God." It is easier to belong to a faction that simply tells what Jesus Christ has done for me, and easier to become a devotee of divine healing, or of a special type of sanctification, or of the baptism of the Holy Spirit. But Paul did not say, "woe is me if I do not preach what Christ has done for me," but, "woe is me if I do not preach the gospel!" And this is the gospel – "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (*My Utmost for His Highest*, October 15 reflection)
